## REGISTRATION

- You must submit an on-line application at [www.bsajamboree.org](http://www.bsajamboree.org)
- You must be approved by your home Scoutmaster
- You must be approved by the Occoneechee Council Jamboree Committee
- You must submit all registration fees per Occoneechee Council's payment schedule

Once your online registration is complete, print a copy of the "2013 National Scout Jamboree Request to Attend" form, obtain the necessary signatures, and submit the form(s) with \$100.00 deposit to Occoneechee Council. **Your application is not complete until Occoneechee Council receives your completed form and deposit.**

## PAYMENT INFORMATION

Occoneechee Council has set the 2013 Jamboree cost at \$1150 for youth and \$950 for adult leaders. This cost is based on the National Jamboree fee and additional council cost to mobilize the council contingent to the Summit Jamboree site. In order to meet our financial obligations for the national jamboree cost we have established the following fee payment schedule. Payments can be made at any time for any amount to the council office as long as the minimum amount due is made by the dates indicated below.

### YOUTH PARTICIPANT PAYMENT SCHEDULE

**Youth participant fees for Occoneechee Council will be \$1150 payable in installments after acceptance into one of the troops or crews.**

**Adult participant fees for Occoneechee Council will be \$950 payable in installments after acceptance as a Troop Leader or Crew Leader.**
